- Does the writer use good description, imagery, and figurative language?
- Does the writer use a consistent point of view in each scene?
- ____ Does the plot maintain the reader's interest?
- Does the writer use dialogue, and does it read naturally? Do action beats replace dialogue tags?

- ____ Does the story come to an appropriate conclusion? Does the end fulfill the promise made in the lead?

For nonfiction pieces

- Does the writer show rather than tell?
- ____ Does the writer vary sentence length and type?
- Does the writer use strong nouns and verbs, avoiding passive voice, weak verbs, and overuse of adverbs and adjectives?
- ____ Does the writer avoid preaching or telling the reader what to do, especially words like should, must, ought to, have to, etc.
- ____ Does the piece maintain the reader's interest?
- ____ Does the piece follow a logical sequence of events?
- If dialogue is used, does it read naturally, and is it appropriate to the piece? Do action beats replace dialogue tags?
- ____ Does the piece come to a logical or appropriate conclusion? Does the ending leave you feeling satisfied or challenged?
- ____ Does the overall work have takeaway value?

For poetry

- ____ Does the poet convey what the poet is trying to say?
- ____ Does the poem maintain good rhythm and flow?
- If traditional verse, does the poem adhere to form?
- Does the poet use a fresh concept, imagery, or figurative language?
- Does the poem appeal to the imagination or emotions or engage the reader's senses?
