The Critique Process*

Guidelines for Critiquers:

- Ask God for discernment and sensitivity.
- Find something positive to say about the manuscript before making suggestions for change.
- Respect one another's beliefs. Do not debate theology.
- Use a check off list to consider various aspects of the manuscripts. You won't help the writer by a casual critique and the comment that "it's wonderful."
- As much as possible, give equal time to all who have manuscripts to read.
- Try to suggest possible markets.
- Strive always to be honest encouragers.

Guidelines for the Person Being Critiqued:

- Have someone else read your manuscript. Hearing your manuscript read aloud is a wonderful
 way of picking up on problem areas.
- If possible, bring copies of your manuscript. It is often much easier for others to spot problem areas when they can see as well as hear it being read.
- Be open to new thoughts and ideas.
- Listen. Do not debate or ague or defend your work.
- Pray about the suggestions you've received.
- Be accountable to work with your manuscript (or with another writing project if you determine the
 manuscript you have read is not worth pursuing) in order to be a good steward of the group's
 time.
- "Commit your work to the Lord, then it will succeed" (Prov. 16:3).
