
Story Essentials

Three essentials for a compelling, page-turning story:

- A character the reader cares about
- A great need the character the reader cares about MUST get Freedom * Life * Love * Security
- A very great obstacle and worthy opponent between character and need

Write fast. Keep writing. Write rough. Get the ideas, scenes, events out of your head and onto the manuscript. Make room in your mind for fresh ideas and insights to add into your manuscript. Write action with verbs and nouns.

Ignore grammar. Ignore research. Ignore details.

Recipe for Memorable Reading

Pivotal Plots * Memorable Characters * Sensational Settings * Dynamic Dialog * Point of View * Inciting Incident * Conflict * Suspense

Plot: The main events of a story, presented as an interrelated sequence. Not necessarily in chronological order. Conflict. 9 basic plots.

Memorable Character: A character the reader cares about.

Sensational Setting: Time, Place, Surroundings, Mood, Cultural nuances, Historical period, Backdrop for a story.

Dynamic Dialog: Economically moves the story forward, reveals crucial plot points, shows something vital about a character. Less is more!
